

"SOMETHING WICKED THIS WAY "COMES"

Macbeth by St Laurence School at Merlin, 06/11/2024 appraised by Holly Meechan

It is my great pleasure to congratulate you, St Laurence School, on your brilliant performance of Macbeth as part of Shakespeare Schools Festival this autumn. It was a joy to watch you shine on your performance night, and I'd like to spend some time now highlighting all the aspects of your production that I loved the most.

Your play had a splendidly spooky start with the ensemble creating the eerie heath. You continued to 'reimagine your company' throughout your piece to great effect creating architecture and shapes to frame each scene, often with the witches watching and weaving in and out of the shadows.

You had great projection and command of the language, speaking Shakespeare's words very clearly and making it sound very natural. What was certainly not natural was the physicality of the witches, I loved how still and sinister their bodies were, with jerky head movements and clawed hands! I also loved their direct relationship with the audience and how they descended upon us, pointing accusatorily at the

I really liked your stylised staging of the banquet scene, creating an image of the vast table stretching right across the stage, and highlighting Macbeth's vision of the ghost. I also enjoyed your choice to speak the 'knock, knock' rather than use a sound effect, this really helped to build the tension in that moment.

You made some smart lighting choices, designed well to emphasise key moments and create a good sense of mood and place. The tartan sashes and shawls were also a great design choice for their simplicity and cohesion. It is clear that everyone was fully and equally invested in this show from the workshop, through to the rehearsals to how you performed on stage- you had a lovely company ethos.

We are in awe of all your passion, hard work and creativity! What you have accomplished is something truly special, and we are already looking forward to reimagining Shakespeare with St Laurence School again next year.
